The State Casting contest was held at the Wisconsin Fishing Expo in Madison in February. We had almost 200 participants and 60 volunteers who helped at the event.

The Bass Federation and its member states have implemented a casting skills accuracy challenge for young anglers across the country!

"The Reel Kids Program" is in many cases the first opportunity that many kids have to be introduced to the great sport of fishing. At events like sport and outdoor shows across the country and in many schools these programs are giving kids the chance to experience what it is really like to handle a fishing rod and reel. They test their skills in the art of Casting, Flipping, and Pitching a plastic jig to a very colorful target.

For the calendar year, our Bass Federation Clubs across the country will conduct approximately 450 events and reach 20,000 kids.

- Top 10 cumulative (each pro/ co) pay entry fee to Divisionals aka Semi Finals- \$3,000 cost. Accepted unanimously


- If someone doesn't show up- the person they were linked with is the person to be pulled. If emergency- we will do what we can to find observer, but no one can go out alone

- Discussed what handicaps mean. Co angler may not come up on front to fish, not even if invited. Can come to front to land a fish, can net a fish from front. Boaters cannot fish from back. No imaginary line in the boat, can cast over head, etc. No 4 hours, no say in where they fish. DQ examples: telling someone they can't fish an area, drifting in deep water so partner cant fish.

- Fishes local club tournaments on Tuesday nights close to home
- Enjoys going out together after the weigh in
- Has one camping weekend each year
- Loves coming to have fun at the convention
- Chooses not to participate in Divisional Qualifiers, Mr. Bass or National Semi Finals
- Sends a club team to the 4 Man Classic
- Has insurance coverage for their club

#### "Grass Roots Club"

- Has 6 club tournaments each year, like to try new places
- Participates in conservation project each year
- Does a launch clean up at every outing
- Focuses on the fun in fishing and teaching others, has guest speakers at their meetings
- Sends their top 2 straight to the National Semi-Finals
- Sends participants to Mr. Bass and 4 Man

#### "Busy Guys Club"

- Has 6 club tournaments on 3 weekends
- Has one club meeting each year
- Most of the club just does one Divisional Qualifier closest to home
- Sends their top 2 straight to the National Semi-Finals
- Sends participants to Mr. Bass, not to 4 Man

#### "All About the Kids Club"

- Has about 6 weekend tournaments each year
- Allows kids to fish with them as part of a youth club
- Families come to see the club weigh ins
- Hosts a youth casting contest each year
- Sends kids to the Youth Championship
- Most adults go to one Divisional Qualifier
- Brings the whole family to Convention to enjoy the waterpark

#### "Middle of the Road Club"

- Has 8 club tournaments each year
- Does a youth project each year
- Has monthly club meetings in off season
- Runs an open tournament each year
- About half their club does 1 Divisional Qualifier, other half do multiple Qualifiers
- Sends their top 2 straight to the National Semi-Finals
- Sends participants to Mr. Bass and 4 Man


#### "Love the Competition Club"


- Does not hold their own club tournaments but uses another series as their club schedule

## Waukesha County Youth Club

The Waukesha County Youth Club is affiliated with Belle City Bass Anglers and Waukesha County UW Extension 4-H. There were about 10 youth in the club last year. They hold 3 educational meetings in the winter to get ready for the season. They hold club tournaments around Waukesha and Racine Counties in a multi species format. Each of the kids can enter fishing related projects in the Waukesha County Fair. Some examples of fair entries have been building a rod, keeping a fishing log, poster on parts of a fish, a collection of antique lures, creating a trivia game, and hand made lures. Many of our kids have gotten grand champion ribbons for their fishing project items.

## TBF/FLW Dues Reminder

It's that time of year again! The new club year is beginning soon, which means it's time to renew your TBF membership! All TBF memberships expire December 31st. To receive the full benefit of a TBF Membership and maintain our insurance coverage policy, you should renew before they expire. TBF does not prorate your dues if you decide to wait, and your club meetings will not be covered by insurance over the winter. It's just like buying a fishing license, you will have to pay the full amount, regardless of when you decide to renew your membership. Most clubs are already collecting dues and sending them in, and we appreciate your hard work, you are doing a great job!
