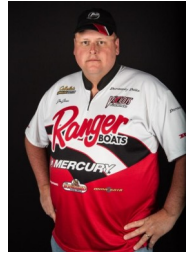

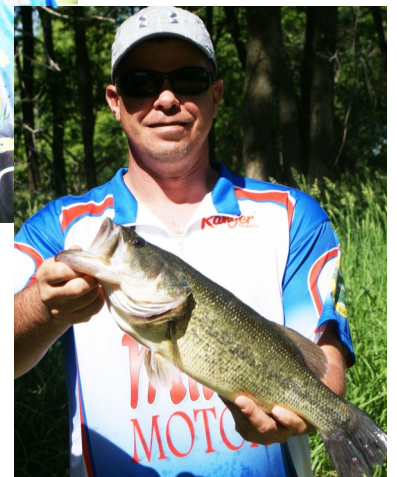

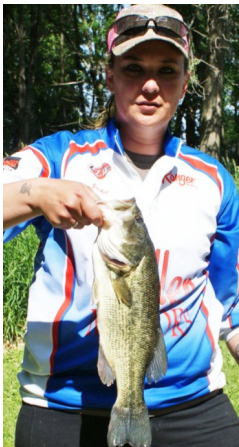

New Wisconsin Format... at a Glance

CHANGES TO DIVISIONALS

- States will no longer compete as teams- no combined weights, no combined payouts
- Smaller divisionals- 2-3 states per divisional= less travel costs
- Wisconsin & Minnesota Division
- Less time frame- weekend tournament
- Boater- Co-Angler Format, not competing against each other
- \$200 boater, \$100 co angler entry fee= more prize money

NEW CHANGES:

- Eliminate current zone and state process as is
- Change to 3 One-Day Divisional Qualifiers spread around the state
- Anyone can fish **any or as many** Divisional Qualifiers as they want
- Divisional Qualifiers will be a Boater- Co-Angler format
- Must sign up as a boater co-angler pair- can be members from any club, but fish separately
- Entry Fees- \$200 - \$100 - 75% payout at ramp

3 DIVISIONAL QUALIFIERS REPLACE ZONES

- 2 Ways to go on- Flexibility
- Each Individual Div Qualifier will take top 7% of Boaters and top 7% of CoAnglers to Divisionals (for those who like our current process)
- Remainder of slots (3%) come from cumulative points from all 3 Div Qualifiers, best 2 of 3. (for those who want to have a trail format)
- State Angler of the Year- top cumulative points winner
- Round % down, always equal Boater- CoAngler
- If person qualifies both ways- individual takes priority, alternate goes down to next cumulative

MR. BASS A DIVISIONAL QUALIFIER TOO

- Mr. Bass becomes a 4th Divisional Qualifier
- Change Mr Bass and Observer to Boater- CoAngler format
- Top Mr Bass Boater and Mr Bass CoAngler from each club eligible to fish- each club decides how to select them
- \$200 - \$100 entry fee, 75% payout at ramp
- Top 10% of Boaters and top 10% of co-anglers go on to Divisionals

ADDITIONAL CHANGES

- Have at least 1 Div Qualifier in conjunction w/ youth/ HS tournament (One Sat- One Sun)
- Criteria for club to send 2 man per club- Reps meetings, Youth or Conservation project, in good standing meeting with all Federation requirements
- Eliminate Zone Director Positions- replace with appointed tournament committee members specific to each tournament location
- Rescind rule requiring to be member the prior year and also rescind 1st year free

SAMPLE NUMBERS

- 30 clubs- 30 boaters & 30 co anglers
 - Mr Bass- 3 boaters & 3 co anglers
 - 3 Divisional Qualifiers- 100 boats each
 - 7 boaters & 7 co anglers each
 - Cumulative Points- 9 boaters & 9 coanglers
 - Total= 63 Boaters & 63 CoAnglers to Divisional
 - 2 Boaters and 2 CoAnglers to Nationals

NATIONAL SEMI-FINALS

LESS TRAVEL - MORE FUN - MORE MEMBERS - MORE MONEY!

Each TBF state holds events as they choose, any number, format, body of water, etc., Members choice!

TBF State Federations

Top 10% of each states event participation (UNLIMITED), or minimum of 12 anglers per state, whichever is greater, advance to National Semi-Final

TBF Clubs In Good Standing

Eligible, active clubs in good standing, (who meet minimum requirements with state, **no paper clubs**) can advance top (2) anglers from club direct to National Semi-Final

TBF National Semi-Finals

- **CLOSE TO HOME**, Over 20 events, (2\3 State Area's)
- Individual Payouts\Advancement
- Popular Boater\Co-Angler Format
- \$200 Entry Fee\Pot For Boaters
- \$100 Entry Fee\Pot For Co-Anglers
- 1 Boater/Co-Angler advances to the Federation National Championship (FNC) from the minimum 12 anglers of each state.
- 1 additional (B/C) advances for each 50 boat milestone reached from each state at it's National Semi-Final! (50, 100, 150, etc.)
- 75% payback to National Semi-Finals individuals, 10% to states, 15% to Federation National Championship
- = 100% payback! + PLUS ADDED PRIZES**

BEST OF THE BEST STATE PRIDE

National Semi-Finals
Top 8 anglers from each state (4 Boaters \ 4 Co-anglers) weights are tracked separate to determine which STATE wins their National Semi-Final!

CO-ANGLERS Catching Fish & WIN!

Top Co-Angler(s) qualifying spots who can weigh in MORE total weight than Top Boaters spots from their state can choose to advance to the FNC as a Boater! We will pull up the next Co-Angler and everyone wins!

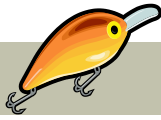

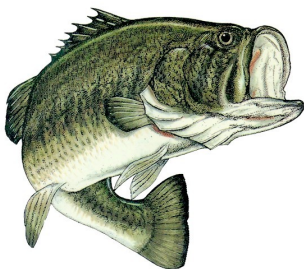
This hands on workshop is designed to teach adults to become instructional builders so that they can facilitate youth workshops in their local areas.
